The garage sale is now 3 days long and we do not hold the sale during Kent Cornucopia days or Renton River days. From last year's feedback we decided to no longer schedule the sale during the Seafair hydroplane races. The garage sale area has expanded to include the entire Tiffany Park Neighborhood area.

### <u>MEETING REPORT—CITY of RENTON</u> STREET SAFETY AND ICY CONDITIONS

The TPNA Steering Committee met with several members of the City of Renton on Feb. 4<sup>th</sup> to continue pursuing solutions to the excessive speeding, traffic safety and icy condition issues in our neighborhood. Traffic Dept. member, Chris Barnes, communicated the following Action Items that are in the works, with the time periods listed for each one. We will keep you informed!

- 1. Perform a speed study on Southeast 16<sup>th</sup> Street east of Ferndale Avenue Southeast. (4-6 weeks)
- Study the intersection of Southeast 16<sup>th</sup> Street and Lake Youngs Way Southeast for possible conversion to a 4way stop. (3-4 weeks).
- 3. Install a sign on Southeast 16<sup>th</sup> Street at Beacon Way Southeast warning of icy conditions on the former street which is capable of being covered, folded or removed when the conditions do not apply. (2-3 weeks) Fabricating this sign will be the determining factor for its date of installation.
- 4. Study the intersections of Edmonds Avenue Southeast at Southeast 16<sup>th</sup> Street and Southeast Royal Hills Drive for traffic control devices that would be appropriate to aid pedestrians in crossing Edmonds Avenue SE. (6-8 weeks.)

### Why should we care about Block Watch?

This information was given by Renton Police Dept. Crime Prevention: Website: <u>http://rentonwa.gov/living/</u> select Law Enforcement and Crime Prevention; then Crime Prevention; then Block Watch

- There were 14 residential burglaries during the month of January, with 0 occurring at an *active* Block Watch residence.
- Total Number of Residential Burglaries in 2008: 291
- Total Number in active Block Watch residences: 3
- Time Frame of Occurrence: Day 158, Night 78, Unknown 55
- Part of Town: NE- 120, NW- 8, N- 12, SE- 100, SW- 11, S-40,
- Method of Entry: According to records, there were 156 forced entry burglaries (54%) and 135 (nonforced) burglaries (46%) during 2006.



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## Tiffany Park Neighborhood Map



Tiffany Park is located in Renton, Washington. The neighborhood membership is open to all residents and property owners of the area bounded by:

- To the NORTH:
  - SE Royal Hills Drive to and including Lake Youngs Way SE
- To the EAST: Pierce Avenue SE to the Renton City Limits.
- To the SOUTH: 116th Avenue SE up to but NOT including SE 157th Street Edmonds Way SE to but not including 157th Street Kirkland Avenue to the pipeline (Kirkland Avenue ends at the pipeline)
- To the WEST: 116th Avenue SE (from SE 157th Street) up to Royal Hills Drive

**To clarify -** Tiffany Park Neighborhood Association (TPNA) includes Tiffany Park Homeowners Association (89 homes), Ponderosa Estates (29 homes), and everything between. The larger area encompasses the smaller ones and the groups work together.
