Annual Meeting

The TPNA annual meeting was held on June 19, 2014 at the Tiffany Park recreation building in

Renton. New officers were elected and a vote was taken on the by-laws.

New officers were elected for the 2014-2015 term using paper ballots to ensure privacy (a requirement of the by-laws). These new officers were elected: president---Donna Thorkildson; vice-president---Laura Silbernagel; treasurer---Bill Roenicke; secretary---Dave Beedon. These non-officers were elected: Renate Beedon, Pam Carino, Ed Eixenberger, Doug Fawcett, Marina Higgins, and Dave Phillips.

Laura Silbernagel was honored for her tireless work as association president. Among other efforts, she has managed the annual garage sale, planned the annual meeting, coordinated the publication and distribution of newsletters and announcements, overseen the Christmas decorations contest, and recruited new members for the association.

Attendees voted to allow Bill Roenicke to remain as treasurer for another year to justify his being voted in during the earlier balloting activity. They also voted to change the bylaws to make the first vote official. This changing of bylaws will take place at the next annual meeting or at a special meeting if one occurs before the annual meeting.

An attendee told the story of his dog's being fatally injured in the bushes next to the Tiffany Park playground. Foul play is suspected. The association is working with the City of Renton to get the bushes trimmed or removed.

PROPOSED HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

On September 26, the City published its determination of the level of impacts caused by the proposed housing development in the woods near Tiffany Park. This SEPA (State Environmental Policy Act) announcement identified certain things the developer must do to mitigate the effects of the development. Interested parties may appeal that decision until October 10 but there is a fee involved. The City's decision and any appeals will be presented to a hearing examiner on October 21. The examiner will rule on those matters within ten days of the hearing. It looks as if the project will be approved as long as the developer performs the required mitigations. A separate administrative phase will follow, during which the City will define other requirements before issuing a construction permit.

Work Party:

The park is in need of some volunteering neighbor TLC presently scheduled for Saturday morning, October 11 (9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.). If it is raining that morning the work party will be postponed to the following Saturday morning. Hopefully this park clean-up can be completed before the weather turns consistently wet and cold. Volunteers will be trimming to restore "see-through-capability" and weeding. Bring your clippers, gloves, some digging tools (to remove unwanted, troublesome, roots), and something to kneel on if desired. With a good crew of volunteers, three hours that morning should restore the desired result.

which ends up in the park, this last winter another stealth invader has definitely made his / their presence known. There is a mole, or perhaps a "whole division" of moles, which have been quietly busy "rooting", making their "mess" throughout the park.

History:

Ginger Creek Park came into being in 2004. The area was described by the original founding group as a muddy parking lot for all manner of vehicles. Additionally, there was concern that the site was drawing drug traffic. Neighbors organized into a group which partnered with the city to bring the 'pocket park" into being. Some of the known names of that original group, which spread truck loads of dirt and fine stone: Blair, Brown, Bullock, Dahlberg, Mauer, Nakanishi, Boy/ Eagle Scouts, other numerous members of the community, and youth and youth groups from the Mormon Church. The park is named after the creek which flows under it through a tube. Also crossing under the park are some pipelines which supply water to communities. Maintenance of the park is all by volunteering neighbors. Grants have been applied for and approved by the city which have funded dirt, gravel for the paths, plantings, tables, kiosk, and dogipot. Volunteer labor hours create credits (X hours = Y dollars) at the rate of \$20.00 an hour to qualify the grants awarded.

- 116th Avenue SE up to but NOT including SE 157th Street
- Edmonds Way SE to but not including 157th Street
- Kirkland Avenue to the pipeline (Kirkland Avenue ends at the pipeline)

To the WEST

• 116th Avenue SE (from SE 157th Street) up to Royal Hills Drive

TPNA includes Tiffany Park Homeowners Association, Ponderosa Estates, and everything between.

As residents we can also become supporting members. We currently have 47 dues paying members this year which is down from 87 last year. This is in a neighborhood of approximately 500 homes with an estimated 1000 potential supporting members. The supporting membership is \$5.00 for adults per year and \$2.50 for seniors (65 and older per year). The voluntary payment of dues gives members the right to vote at the annual meeting.

Just tell the cashier that you are a supporting member of the Tiffany Park Neighborhood Association.
