It is that time of year when we get all of the homeowners and renters to come together and help disperse information about what we have done in the past, what we want to do in the next year, to find out who is going to direct us in our efforts, and how we plan on paying for it.

Everyone in the Tiffany Park Neighborhood is invited---home owners and renters. We do have provisions in our bylaws that prevent renters from voting on things, but we always value your input and want you to feel welcome to be involved in this process. This year we have some bylaw issues to vote on ,as well as board members. We want to inform you about issues effecting the neighborhood, and find out what you would like us to do in the upcoming year. We do need to vote on proposed changes to our bylaws. See following to preview those changes.

Tiffany Park Neighborhood Association Bylaws-(July5, 2006) (Amended Revised April 2009) Boundaries – The boundaries of the Association are: To the North: SE Royal Hills Drive to and including-Lake Youngs Way SE

To the East: Pierce Ave S, To the Renton City Limits To the South: 116th Avenue SE up to but not including-SE 157th St...

Edmonds Way SE up to but not including 157th St. Kirkland Avenue t the pipeline.(Kirkland Avenue ends at the pipeline.

This entire area encompasses Ponderosa Estates and-Tiffany Park Homeowners Association.

Boundaries of the Tiffany Park Neighborhood Association area will be in compliance with the City Of Renton.

No officer may serve more than three consecutiveterms in the same office.

No officer other than the Treasurer may be allowed to serve more than three consecutive terms

Crime

(Crime in the neighborhood; ways to prevent it, why we want to report it, and who to report it to.)

Q: What is crime?

A: Crime is any of the following:

- Destruction of property, such as slashed tires, broken car windows, stolen or defaced fences and lawn ornaments, etc.
- Robberies (a home is entered by force or other means and items are taken without permission, whether by people you know or don't know)
- Auto theft
- Excessive noise (be reasonable)
- Sale of drugs or alcohol to minors or consumption thereof in public places
- Theft of mail from a porch or mailbox (this is a Federal crime). More on mailboxes below.

Q: Should you report suspicious behavior?

A: Yes, absolutely. The only thing that could possibly go wrong with reporting suspicious

behavior is that you are wrong, but you may save a friend or a neighbor from harm or damage. Not all calls are emergencies, but you can still say "I would like an officer to visit."

Calling the police is great, but also helpful to the neighborhood is communication of criminal activity to your neighbors. Good places to do that are e-mail messages and the TPNA website.

Be observant of the vehicles and people on your street. Get to know your neighbors. You should know your neighbor's name and how to contact them if you have a question.

Another thing that residents on smaller streets and cul-de-sacs have been doing is replacing standard mailboxes with locked mailboxes. This is not a sure-fire way to prevent mail theft, but it can deter a thief because of time and effort to break in. There is a fee for installation, but it may be well worth the cost. If this is not something that can be agreed on it is suggested that you never put bills with checks in outgoing mail. Take your bills to the post office for mailing, and know the risks to letting your mail sit in an unlocked box until you come home

Renton Youth Advocacy Center

Most of you will have noticed that the once vacant Tiffany Park Building is now home to a youth center.

You may also have met the moms, dads, youth and grandparents on our neighborhood outreach teams as they've gone door to door in your neighborhood. Our board members and volunteers come from all walks of life and belong to many community organizations. For instance, our website administrator currently serves on the Parent Key Communicators Board for Renton School District.

Renton Youth Advocacy Center has been in operation for over a year now. Started by John Houston, an honors graduate of Olympic College who holds a degree in Human Services, and certificates in Family Services and Chemical Dependency Counseling, RYAC fills a definite need in our community. Our purpose is to give Renton youth a place where they can safely spend after-school hours that otherwise might be spent unwisely, in unsafe environments and without supervision. Our caring volunteers are dedicated to promoting self-worth, helping youth achieve academic success, encouraging essential team skills and creating bonds between young people and community members. Local volunteers moms, dads, grandparents, uncles and aunts, and older youth - create a community where at-risk youth are accepted, nurtured and guided to be thriving, active and engaged members of society.

Initially we offered a safe place to hang out after school one day a week. Youth could play games, get homework help, or use sports equipment. With the help of dedicated volunteers, our program has expanded to include 2 days a week. RYAC has up to 40 teens and tweens at the center on Tuesdays and Thursdays, 3 - 6 p.m. We've been able to increase our age range too, and siblings are welcome with older children. We were able to offer summer hours last year and hope to be open this summer, three weekdays, 12 - 5. We now have a grant writer and have received two programbuilding grants during 2015. There are now laptops available for homework, seasonal art and crafts sessions and community service opportunities. All of this is done with volunteers (RYAC has no paid staff). One of our biggest goals is to have enough volunteers to staff the center and keep the doors open three to four days a week.

During 2015 we partnered with Seattle Central College and WSU for service learning. We hope to continue these partnerships and also join the

University of Washington's program within the next six months. Also in development is an interview seminar for youth looking for a first job, or wanting to get a better summer job. We'll be growing the program with a resume help seminar in 2016. Our plan is to also add a FAFSA completion day in 2016 for college-bound youth. (FAFSA stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid.)

We like participating in local events, and being part of an active neighborhood community. To show our support, we're sponsoring the neighborhood games for the combined Tiffany Park/Cascade picnic this year. We'll see you there!
